The Debate Continues - Historic Building Additions, What's Appropriate? Tuesday, July 12; 6:00-7:30 pm Speaker: Daron Tapscott, Preservation Architect

Since the ascendancy of modernist architecture in the 1950s, architects and homeowners have struggled with whether to create an addition that seems as if it belonged to the original structure or to create an addition that is clearly distinguishable as twenty-first century construction. Hear one architect's view on designing compatible yet distinguishable additions to historic buildings.

The Hidden History of St. Paul United Methodist Church

Thursday, July 14; 6:00-7:30pm Speaker: Jon Rollins, Principal, Good Fulton & Farrell ArchitectsFrom its founding more than 140 years ago by a community of freed slaves to today, the congregation and cultural setting of St. Paul UMC has dramatically changed and evolved. This presentation will document some of the hidden architectural and cultural histories revealed during the brief window provided by the rehabilitation of this Dallas Landmark structure.

Freedmantown/North Dallas: Changes to a Cultural Landscape Tuesday, July 19; 6:00-7:30pm Speaker: Marsha Prior, Director, Historical Research Services, Geo-Marine, Inc.

Although North Dallas was racially and ethnically diverse when it was established as a freedmantown in 1869, segregation and deed restrictions created a neighborhood that was almost exclusively African American by the early 1900s. Known today as Uptown, North Dallas' landscape is drastically altered, but a few remnants of the built environment remain to tell of its fascinating history.

Industrial Hipsters: A History of Deep Ellum

Thursday, July 21; 6:00-7:30pm Speaker: Robert Meckfessel, Principal, DSGN Associates, Inc. This talk will provide an overview of the vibrant history of Deep Ellum, including its widely (and wildly) diverse architectural and cultural history. From its earliest days as an industrial center, its heyday in the 30s as a blues and jazz center, and all the way through its edgy rebirth in the 80s and 90s; Deep Ellum has played a unique and colorful role in Dallas history.

Midcentury Modern Resources for Homeowners

Tuesday, July 26; 6:00-7:30pm Speaker: Cliff Welch, AIA, Welch Architecture

In addition to the overall design, this genre has its own palette of materials: from paint colors, plastic laminate, ceramic tile, cabinetry, and furnishings. This talk will discuss the approach that one firm takes on resourcing and the restoration of post-war modern residential architecture and interiors.

DOOR-TO-DOOR SOLICITATION SCAMS

Summertime is prime time for door-to-door scams. The Better Business Bureau recently released a list of the latest scams, www.dallas.bbb.org. Below are a few that we have heard or witnessed happening in our area

Door-to Door Magazine Sales - These con men use high-pressure tactics on their victims. This year, BBB has received 662 complaints involving these scams. This summer, BBB recommends the following on how to handle magazine salesmen: listen carefully, be aware of high pressure sales tactics, stand strong, verify the individual and the company, and know your rights.

Alarm System Door-to-Door Sales - Some businesses can be pushy. Before you make a major purchase, check out the company first at bbb.org. Also, find out if the

company is properly licensed in your state and if they screen employees before hiring. Get bids from at least three companies before selecting an installer. Be sure you compare similar systems on price.

Energy Scams are a great way for scam artists to cash in. Beware of door-to-door salespeople, unsolicited letters, or phone calls that promise to save energy and money on bills. Signing up for such offers can cause a monthly bill to skyrocket. Hidden charges could apply, due to switching service or cancellation fees.

More tips from the BBB:

- Always ask for proper identification before listening to the pitch.
- Never let a stranger inside your home.
- If you feel threatened, call the police at 9-1-1

Watch Your Speed - With summer having arrived and schools being out of session, there's an increase in bar-b-ques, outdoor parties, visitors and children playing in the yards and sidewalks in Vickery Place the coming months. Inevitably, there will be more adults and children in our streets. Watch your speed!



The speed limit on most Vickery Place streets is 30 mph, however 25 mph is recommended in a residential neighborhood. With the increased number of visitors and children outside and runners and walkers enjoying our neighborhood and streets, please observe the speed limit and watch out for your neighbors and other pedestrians.

SUMMER SAFETY



DON'T LEAVE ANYONE IN A PARKED CAR IN THE HEAT! Summer is here and that means sweltering temperatures in Texas. We read in the paper or see on TV all too often where someone has died from being left in a parked car. Children, the elderly, and pets rely on parents, caregivers and owners to watch out for them. Never leave a helpless person or pet in a parked car in the summer heat. If it is 93 degrees Fahrenheit the temperature inside a car, even with the windows open a bit, will climb to 102 degrees in as little as 10 minutes, to 125 degrees in just 20 minutes and approximately 140 degrees in 40 minutes. A parked car in our summer heat is deadly. Below are some precautions that you might take:

- If you are traveling with an infant or child riding in a rear seat car seat, it is suggested that you place your purse or briefcase in the backseat next to the child as a reminder when you park and exit the car that the child is with you.
- As tempting as it is to take your pet along when you run errands, during the summer months leave him at home or make sure that your destination is Fido Friendly.
- Keep your car locked when parked on a residential street or in your drive-way to prevent a small child from opening the door, climbing inside and becoming trapped.

Lives are busy, lifestyles hectic. Plus some things that we did not have to consider several years ago have changed—for instance, there were no laws mandating children and car seats to the back seat of a vehicle. Please take these reminders to heart and pass them on to others. If you see a child or the elderly left in a parked car, call 911. If you see an animal in a parked car in the heat, you must act. Notify the store manager to make an announcement for the owner to return to the car, call 911 or the fire department. Stay around to make sure the situation is resolved.
