VICKERY PLACE SNAPSHOT...1982

On January 28, 1982, nearly 100 Vickery Place neighbors gathered together in the basement of the Greenville Avenue Christian Church for a meeting with representatives of the Dallas Department of Housing and Neighborhood Services to consider the future of the neighborhood. This article is the ninth in a series of snapshots of the information presented by the City at that meeting and information later published in the planning guide for our neighborhood.

The planning guide recommended five self-help activities to address the residents' concerns about the appearance of the neighborhood: a clean-up program, a paint-up program, yard beautification, home improvement education and vector control. A clean-up program, including an education element, would be organized by the neighborhood organization with the assistance of Clean Dallas Inc., local PTA, youth groups and the City. After the clean-up, the Street and Sanitation Department would arrange additional trash pick-ups. For a paint-up program, residents would acquire paint at a reduced cost or by donation. Other local organizations might provide volunteers to help paint homes for owners unable to do so. The paint-up program was recommended because it "can have a rapid and highly visible positive impact on the appearance of the neighborhood".

Neighborhood meetings and newsletters could provide yard beautification and maintenance information from County Agricultural agents and garden clubs. The Park Department would remove dead trees in the parkway by owner request. For most of 1982, the City funded a Home Repair Training Program that taught citizens the how-to's of home repair—including plumbing, electricity and carpentry. There were no fees for hardship cases and reduced fees for our neighborhood as part of a target area.

Vector control (getting rid of rats, mice, insects and other pests) was not ranked as a high priority in the neighborhood survey, but the City offered the assistance of Health and Human Services Department in providing advice and literature to residents who needed help.

Next time: what financial investment resources were available to Vickery Place residents? (How did the City and private institutions contribute to the revitalization of the neighborhood?)

Junius Heights was built at what was the eastern edge of the city of Dallas in 1906. Avertisements of the day promised that Junius Heights would "become the choicest residential section of Dallas." The neighborhood was served by the Junius Heights streetcar line until streetcar service was discontinued.

Today Junius Heights has an active neighborhood association that obtained historic designation in May 2006, making it Dallas' newest and largest historic district. It is the largest collection of Arts and Crafts/Craftsman homes in the southwest, and includes Prairie and Tudor styles in a neighborhood of well over 700 homes in Old East Dallas, situated east of Munger Place, south of Swiss Avenue and southwest of Lakewood.

WOMAN IN A MOMENT - Tuesday November 20, 2007 - January 2, 2008

Patty Rooney's upcoming exhibit at the Garden Cafe, 5310 Junius, showcases legendary female figures. Rooney chose the medium of encaustic, beeswax and pigment used by ancient Egyptians and Greeks. Anna Karenina, Madame Bovary, Lady MacBeth, all tragic or heroic icons as well as a few modern day women such as Marilyn Monroe, Jacqueline Kennedy and Frida Kahlo are featured in this award winning exhibit. 25% of the proceeds from the sale of Rooney's paintings are donated to the local charity, the Magdalen House (commonly known as Maggie's House).

SWEET POTATO-PUMPKIN CUPCAKES WITH CREAM CHEESE FROSTING

Makes two dozen cup-cakes

1 cup coarsely chopped pecans

2 cups sugar

1 cup butter, softened

4 large eggs

1 (16oz.) can mashed sweet potatoes

2/3 cup orange juice

1 tsp. vanilla extract

3 cups all-purpose flour

1 tsp. baking powder

1 tsp. ground cinnamon

½ tsp. baking soda

½ tsp. ground nutmeg

½ tsp. salt

Cream Cheese Frosting

Garnish: coarsely chopped pecans

Place pecans in a single layer in a shallow pan. Bake at 350 for 8 to 10 minutes or until toasted, stirring once after 4 minutes.


Beat sugar and butter at medium speed with an electric mixer until blended. Add eggs, 1 at a time, beating until blended after each addition.

Whisk together mashed sweet potatoes, orange juice, and vanilla extract. Combine flour and next 5 ingredients. Add flour mixture to sugar mixture alternately with sweet potato mixture, beginning and ending with flour mixture. Beat at low speed just until blended after each addition. Fold in toasted pecans. Place foil baking cups in muffin pans, and coat with vegetable cooking spray. Spoon batter into cups, filling two—thirds full.

Bake at 350 for 28 to 30 minutes or until a wooden pick inserted into center comes out clean. Remove immediately from pans, and cool 50 minutes to 1 hour or until completely cool. Spread cupcakes evenly with Cream Cheese Frosting.
